Job Gains




The region gained 11,600 private sector jobs. Government jobs declined by 100 over the past year.

Regional Industry Mix, August 2023









The unemployment rate in the Hudson Valley remained unchanged over the past year






Unemployment Rates(Not Seasonally Adjusted), 2013-2023

August Unemployment Rates, 2013 to 2023





Hudson Valley's Diversity Index increased by 15% from 2010 to 2020 US Census Bureau Diversity Index Scores, 2010 and 2020





Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

Westchester Medical Center (WMCHealth) in Valhalla (Westchester County) announced plans to build a new \$221 million patient care facility on its campus. The Patient Care Tower on the Westchester Medical Center campus will be the Hudson Valley's hub of critical care medicine, bringing together critical care and medical-surgical specialties in one location, while enabling WMC to convert to all private inpatient rooms across the rest of its campus. The new five-story building will have 128 new rooms spread over four floors with conference center space on the ground floor. The services provided will include trauma care, neurosciences, cardiology and general surgery. All the rooms in the new building will be equipped for more intensive patient care. Construction of the new 163,000-square-foot medical care facility is expected to take 24 months, creating an estimated 250 temporary construction jobs and 127 new full-time jobs once operational.

Lidl, an international supermarket chain with 11,550 stores in 32 countries, plans to open a 900,000-square-foot warehouse and distribution center at iPark 84 (former IBM East Campus) in East Fishkill (Dutchess County). Plans for the massive warehouse call for loading docks to accommodate 148 trucks at once and parking spaces for 137 trucks and 335 cars. According to a published report, the supermarket retailer operates 171 stores in 10 states along the U.S. East Coast, with plans to open stores in Yonkers (Westchester County) and Orangetown (Rockland County). It is estimated that the warehouse and distribution center would have about 200 to 250 employees.

Pfizer is expanding its footprint in Rockland County. The pharmaceutical giant has recently renewed and expanded its lease at Industrial Realty Group's Hudson Valley iCampus in Pearl River. The deal includes more than 150,000 square feet of manufacturing, laboratory, warehouse and office space in multiple buildings over the next five years. Pfizer will use the space for its Global Supply division, which produces commercial antibody drug conjugates for its oncology business with clinical scales capabilities. Pfizer also owns about 23 acres contiguous to iCampus where it is investing \$470 million to build a state-of-the-art laboratory and office building for its Vaccine Research and Development division on a portion of the land that it owns. The company has not yet announced how many jobs will be created with its latest round of expansion. According to a published report, the company employs approximately 1,000 employees at the Pearl River location. Last year's \$470 million expansion announcement, which is slated for completion in 2026, will create 100 new jobs according to estimates.
