In November 2023, there were 810,600 private sector jobs and 964,000 nonfarm (private + government) jobs in the region.

Job Gains




The region gained 6,500 private sector jobs over the past year. Government jobs were unchanged.

Regional Industry Mix, November 2023





Over-the-Year Change in Jobs, November 2023






Unemployment Rate

All of the largest labor force areas in the Hudson Valley Region, except the cities of Mount Vernon and Yonkers, had unemployment rates below the State's unemployment rate in November 2023.

The State's unemployment rate (4.0%) exceeds the region's unemployment rate (3.5%) by 0.5 percentage points.

November Unemployment Rates, 2013 to 2023







US Census Bureau Diversity Index Scores, 2010 and 2020



Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

Atlas Air Worldwide, which had been headquartered in Purchase (Westchester County), recently announced plans to relocate to White Plains (Westchester County), where it will occupy 60,000 square-feet of space at the new location. The airliner will invest \$4 million in tenant improvements such as new equipment, information technology and security. New York's Empire State Development approved a \$2 million capital grant to help the company relocate to the new facility. The grant is contingent on Atlas keeping its current headquarters' workforce of 400 employees for at least five years. The company also maintains a facility at Kennedy Airport where it employs 265 people.

Developers of the former Galleria Mall property in White Plains (Westchester County) recently released detailed plans for the property as they seek support for the project. Dubbed "District Galleria," the mixed-use project is expected to include seven residential towers ranging from 352 feet to 650 feet, office space, retail and open space to replace the former 870,000 square foot shopping venue. The residential towers would include 3,200 apartments, of which 384 would be designated as affordable housing. The new residential complex will target young adults, families and empty nesters, ranging from 25 to 70 years old. According to the developer, each building could create about 500 temporary construction jobs.

MGM Resorts International recently unveiled its plan to transform Empire City Casino by MGM Resorts into a full-scale, world-class casino resort, MGM Empire City, if awarded a commercial casino license by the state. Plans for the Yonkers (Westchester County) casino call for a comprehensive casino floor redevelopment and expansion, including a new 5,000-capacity entertainment venue with state-of-the-art BetMGM sportsbook, food and beverage outlets, cocktail bars and lounges and meeting spaces. The New York State Gaming Commission is expected to decide on awarding the three downstate gaming licenses soon. According to the CEO of MGM Resorts, the new entertainment venue would create thousands of jobs.

Bad news

Members of Local 32BJ SEIU, the union representing janitors in the Hudson Valley Region, recently voted to go on strike when their union could not reach a contract agreement with commercial contractors. Over 1,500 workers who clean 52 million square feet of space at 132 commercial buildings are scheduled to walk off the job starting midnight December 31 if a contract agreement is not reached. The union has been negotiating since September 2023 to secure pay raises and maintain employer-paid health care benefits for its members.
