

Who is ALICE

<u>ALICE</u>: <u>Asset Limited</u>, <u>Income Constrained</u>, <u>Employed</u>















Key Terms

A **household** consists of all the people who occupy a housing unit. In this Report, households do not include those living in group quarters such as a dorm, nursing home, or prison.

The **Household Survival Budget** estimates the actual bare-minimum costs of basic necessities (housing, childcare, food, transportation, health care, and a basic smartphone plan) in New York, adjusted for different counties and household types, including seniors.

The **ALICE Threshold** is the average income that a household needs to afford the basic necessities defined by the Household Survival Budget for each county in New York. Households **Below the ALICE Threshold (BAT)** include both ALICE and poverty-level households.

The **ALICE Essentials Index** is a measure of the average change over time in the costs of the essential goods and services that households need to live and work in the modern economy — housing, childcare, food, transportation, health care, and a smartphone plan.







Cost and Wage Comparison 2021 and 2022













Families with Children in the Hudson Valley, 2022




Hudson Valley ALICE Households by Age, 2022



Hudson Valley ALICE Households by Age




Hudson Valley ALICE Households by Race/Ethnicity, 2022







Inflation by Time Period



Inflation Hitting ALICE Harder

Because of increases in prices over the past 12 months respondents below the ALICE Threshold were more likely than those above to have:

- Switched to cheaper, used less or stopped using products (82% vs. 71%)
- Reduced savings (59% vs. 47%)
- Delayed a major purchase (57% vs. 45%)
- Worked more or got another job (24% vs. 14%)
- Increased borrowing (20% vs. 12%)
- Rent increased (40% vs. 17%)


